

Find a Home on Your Own

1. Advertise on Facebook, Instagram, NextDoor and Craig's List.
2. Ask your veterinarian if they can post a flyer in their office.
3. Charge a small \$25-\$40 adoption fee to dissuade those with ill intentions.

Relinquishment to Ventura County Animal Services:
If you live in areas serviced by VCAS and have been unsuccessful in rehoming your bunny, you can contact KeepMyPet@ventura.org for additional support or to schedule a time and day (based on space and availability) to bring in the bunny. There is a \$45 - \$110 fee per rabbit to relinquish an owned rabbit. We do not euthanize rabbits for space, but please know it can take a while to find the right home for them.
